### **GOOD SHEPHERD /VOCATION SUNDAY**

The popular, romantic image of a shepherd that many of us have is a world away from the reality of a shepherd's life at the time of Jesus. Long before the chosen people settled as farmers, they had wandered from place to place living in tents and leading their animals from one pasture to another. At the time of Jesus there was old rivalry between the nomads roaming with their flocks and the settled tillers of the soil. Shepherds were regarded as an unhappy mixture of gypsy and roaming thief, not least because their flocks sometimes ate their way through private property.

Because of the roving nature of their job they could not honour the demands of the ceremonial law and so were regarded as religious outcasts.

Jesus in speaking of himself as the shepherd is allying himself with the people on the margins of society. He is the wandering preacher who has been rejected by his own people in Nazareth. He is always on the move, even when the hospitality is generous.

As the shepherd he is always going ahead of his flock seeking out new pasture. He takes risks knowing that there will be a few wolves about trying to outsmart him.

**Vocations Sunday**— "O Jesus, send labourers into your fields which are awaiting holy apostles, saintly priests, heroic missionaries and dedicated sisters and brothers. Enkindle in the hearts of men and women the spark of a vocation. Grant that Christian families may desire to give your Church helpers in the work of tomorrow."
